

Renewable Energy for Maine

"A Future of Sustainability" is a series of four presentations starting in November put on by the Wolfe's Neck

Farm Foundation for the community to learn from experts and leaders about energy choices at home and for Maine. The presentations followed by public discussion will be at the Freeport Community Center, 53 Depot Street, Freeport, from 7:00 p.m. until 8:30 p.m. on Thursday: November 20th, January 22nd, February 26th, and March 26th. There will be a reception at 6:30 p.m. before each event. On January 22nd former Governor Angus King will be speaking about wind power in Maine. On February 26th, Dr. Harry "Dutch" Dresser, who founded Maine Energy Systems with Les Otten, will speak about the potential of Maine to be an energy provider. Dr. Dresser will present about wood pellet stoves as part of a comprehensive solution. The last presenter is Naoto Inoue, the president of Solar Market in Arundel, on March 26th. He will be presenting on the economic justification for building with or converting to solar electric and thermal systems, and will present practical information, including next steps to take. There is a suggested \$5 donation for each event, and reservations, while not required, are suggested, as the event was well attended the past two years.
